

Elementary: 1st - 6th Grade

Our elementary students receive a great deal of one-on-one attention. Multi-grade classrooms in the upper grades, give our older students the opportunity to enhance the subjects in which they excel. Elementary classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:15 am to 3:00 pm.

Full day Kindergarten

Our full-day Kindergarten class is held from 8:15 am to 3:00 pm Monday through Friday.

In addition to regular academic classroom curriculum, a rich schedule of "specials" expose students to lifelong learning skills in the following areas:

BIBLE - All students in K-6 receive BIBLE instruction in their classrooms 4 days per week. All students also participate in a weekly **Chapel Service** that includes activities, movement, music, and prayer.

Music - We are blessed to have a full-time music program that provides K-6 students with a music class every day. Emphasis is placed on rhythm, movement, learning to read music, music appreciation, and performance. Preschool students attend a weekly music class, as well.

Computer - Beginning in third grade, students are taught formal keyboarding and word processing skills. A computer lab allows whole classrooms to participate in computer assisted instruction with teacher supervision.

Art - Weekly art classes are provided to all elementary students. Emphasis here is placed on developing basic cutting and drawing skills, following directions, being creative, working with a variety of materials, and appreciating the many types of arts.

Physical Education - Each class meets once a week to help students develop strength, stamina, and agility skills so children can feel more confident in pursuing a healthy lifestyle through movement, exercise, and sports.

Library – Primary classes meet weekly in the HIS Kids library to hear stories and to borrow and exchange books. The library is open to upper elementary students for instruction in library skills and research under the direction of the classroom teacher. Books are also available for older students to borrow as well. Preschool students may also borrow books during their weekly library visit.
